

6 Years Ago...

In 2003, Marc and I went to our first Preview Weekend. Marc had just graduated with his master's degree and we were nervously exploring if God was calling us to be missionaries.

We came to Orlando for a weekend where we learned about Campus Crusade's critical need for people with technical skills and what becoming missionaries entailed.

Today...

The need for people with technical and operational skills is greater than ever. Computers have accelerated the spread of the gospel, but to continue we must have more workers.

So earlier this year, Marc and I helped lead our 5th Preview Weekend. We spent time getting to know college seniors who were praying about joining staff with Campus Crusade for Christ — just like we were 6 years ago.

Our goal was to recruit for a new internship program being launched this fall.

Because of the economy, there are significant projects without enough staff members. The prayer is that this internship program will bring 20 or more new graduates to Orlando who will spend 9 months working on those projects.

Overcoming Fears...

During the conference, Evangeline connected with Elisheba, a marketing graduate from UNC Wilmington. Elisheba thought God might be calling her to intern, but the fear of rejection was holding her back.



A few weeks ago, Elisheba e-mailed Evangeline, “Hey! I got accepted for the internship! Thanks for encouraging me to apply. :)”

Marc was able to talk with 7 students with computer-related degrees. In all, 100 students applied for operations internships and 25 put headquarters as their first choice!

We are grateful for the way God is providing these much needed workers. Thank you for your prayers.
