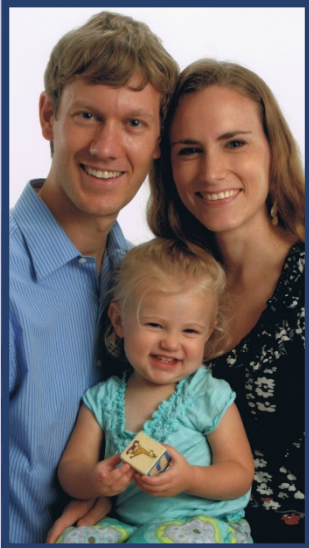

Less than a year ago, Marc and I agreed to direct Campus Crusade's first 9-month internship program at headquarters. We had no idea how much work it would be — or how much we would end up loving our interns.

We had 8 recent college grads join us and it was amazing to see them blossom. Our goal was that these men and women would finish as mature leaders who would have a missions mindset wherever God calls them – ministry, the workforce, and at home.

We invested deeply in the interns by giving them coaches, meeting with them twice a week, having them over for dinner many times and teaching them to share their faith each Friday.

To use a military term, we think of our work with these interns as a “force multiplier.” Marc is one computer guy, but next year because of his work with the interns there will be 4. I was one writer, but in my place now there are 2. And this is just the beginning.

7 out of the 8 interns are coming back and the 8th will be representing God as a journalist in the workforce! 3 are joining staff and 4 are interning again.

Plus 12 new interns will join them this August. Next year, Marc and I will lead a team of 5 people overseeing the internship. We have been asking God for more spiritual workers—and through your prayers and support, He is providing!

God at Work in Haiti

When the earthquakes hit Haiti, everyone was unprepared. I can sympathize with devastated people wondering where God was.

It helps me to hear stories of mercy. GAIN, Campus Crusade for Christ's humanitarian arm, was preparing for hurricane season shortly before the earthquake.

They had moved millions of ready-to-eat meals to Haiti so they would be easy to distribute wherever needed. After the earthquake, not even military could get in. But Campus Crusade was able to start distributing food designed for just such a crisis. It was a lifeline to thousands.

A few weeks ago Campus Crusade's headquarters turned into a huge packing plant. Oats, rice, protein powder and other grains were measured into 103,999 packets to be shipped to Haiti.

Annada and I were able to help. Just 25 cents paid for a packet that fed a family of four for a day if volunteers packed the bags.

Annada and Brennan (Annada's best-friend) saved quarters for about a month. Then I held the collection tubes and Annada and Brennan filled them with quarters. We talked about how they were helping kids have enough to eat.

On the day of the packing we had saved enough to buy 44 packets. That's 528 meals! After turning in our quarters, we watched as hundreds of volunteers packed the food.
