We also found out we qualified for first-time homeowners assistance. Florida's foreclosure rate had just gone through the roof and the state was given extra money to help people... like us!

It looked like we could buy. We were so excited. But then things got rough. Getting government assistance isn't easy. Our situation kept changing day-to-day.

One week before closing, we lost one of the grants because our paycheck looks odd (due to donations). We were really disappointed.

And yet that day, a couple who are ministry partners with us decided they wanted to give a donation toward our house... ***in exactly the amount we were missing!***

There are so many other crazy details, but the point is we are so grateful God has provided through your prayers and financial gifts to buy a townhouse that is close to work. It is a huge relief to know we don't have to move every year anymore. Thank you!

"What was happening in Virginia seemed surreal until I remembered Elaine goes to school there. Elaine is an amazing woman from Taiwan I connected with during Orlando Summer Project (OSP).

Less than a year ago I was going to lunch with her and talking about life... now I'm praying for her as she grieves the loss of a close friend—one of four Campus Crusade students who died in the shootings. It is a time where everyone is asking big, God-sized questions. I have to believe God is big enough to meet the challenge."
