

## Upgrading the Human Resources System

This a huge project that will allow Campus Crusade to track its half-a-million volunteers and give them resources (access to secure Web sites and money, if appropriate). In some countries most of the workers are volunteers, so this will greatly increase their effectiveness.

This project will also allow Campus Crusade to keep a database of its missionaries' job skills (languages, experience etc.) This is vital, especially during crises like Hurricane Katrina or Virginia Tech. Right now, Campus Crusade wastes precious time trying to find out by word-of-mouth who is qualified to form response teams.
