


2) We would have wisdom to know what is "the best"


There are so many good things we can do! We constantly have to choose what to be involved in or how much to work. Please pray we would have wisdom to know where God wants us to invest our time.




Marc as a baby and a 4-year-old

Thank you so much for praying for our associates in Asia. The situation has become even more sensitive. As a result, I need to be very careful about what I write.

The initial trial is over. God was sovereign and we join those in Asia in thanking God for how He has used their witness. Also, there were no riots, which is an answer to prayer.

Everyone on trial was convicted and is now in prison. Please continue to pray for these men and women and their families. Please pray specifically for the children who have been separated from their parents. And ask God to move in the hearts of those in power to release these men and women.

Those in prison ask that we pray for them to be filled with the Spirit and have courage to share God's love freely. Please pray they would be grounded in truth and their physical needs provided for.

Thank you so much for your partnership with us. Your prayers are powerful and we thank God for them.

I may not be able to send another update on these men and women. I wish I could - I know it is easier to pray when you are regularly updated. But I am confident every prayer you send makes a difference.
